PATIENT INFORMATION

CT/ ULTRASOUND **GUIDED CATHETER DRAINAGE**

A pigtail catheter is inserted for drainage of fluids or air from body cavities, commonly used in conditions such as pleural or peritoneal effusions, or abscess drainage.

Before the Procedure:

- 1. Patient Information:
 - Ensure the patient is aware of the procedure and has provided informed consent.
 - Inform the healthcare provider of any allergies, medications, or medical conditions the patient may have.

2. Preparation:

 Follow any pre-procedure fasting or preparation instructions provided by the healthcare provider.

During the Procedure:

1. Sterility:

• Local anesthesia may be administered to numb the area where the catheter will be inserted.

• If drainage is required, the pigtail catheter may be connected to a drainage bag. Follow specific instructions regarding the care and emptying of the drainage bag.




We make every effort to keep your appointment time, however any complex cases, elderly & frail patients can cause unexpected delays.

 Adhere to any follow-up appointments scheduled by the healthcare provider. Report any unusual symptoms or concerns promptly.


3. Complications:


 Be aware of potential complications such as infection, catheter dislodgement, or blockage. Contact the healthcare provider if any issues arise.
