

# What is a Biopsy?

it involves removing of a small sample of tissue from the body for examination under a microscope.

#### What is FNAC?

FNAC is a type of biopsy that uses a thin, hollow needle to extract a small sample of cells from a suspicious area.

# Purpose of Biopsy and FNAC:

Diagnosis: help determine nature of mass/ abnormality detected in imaging.

- Staging Cancer: If malignancy is confirmed, help determine the extent/ stage
- Treatment Planning: Biopsy results guide healthcare providers in planning appropriate treatments.

# **Patient Preparation:**

- Explanation: Your healthcare provider will explain the procedure, its purpose, and any potential risks.
- Consent: Obtain necessary consents before the procedure.
- Fasting: Follow any fasting instructions provided by your healthcare team.

### **During the Procedure:**

- Positioning: You will be positioned appropriately for the biopsy or FNAC procedure.
- · Local Anesthesia: Local anaesthesia may be used to minimize discomfort during the procedure.
- Needle Insertion: The thin needle is inserted into the target area to collect the tissue or cell sample.

#### After the Procedure:

- Observation: You may be observed for a short period to monitor for any immediate complications.
- Activity: In most cases, you can resume normal activities after the procedure.

#### **Results:**

• Timing: The timing for receiving results may vary. Your healthcare provider will discuss the findings and potential treatment options with you.

#### **Risks and Considerations:**

- Bleeding and Infection: While uncommon, bleeding or infection at the biopsy site can occur.
- Discomfort: You may experience mild discomfort or bruising at the biopsy site.
- Please bring any prior scans (like X-rays, ultrasounds, MRI or CT) and reports as these will help us better assess your condition.
